About Abu Dhabi Desert Challenge

The Abu Dhabi Desert Challenge is one of the world's oldest and most prestigious international cross-country rallies.

The event was founded in 1991 by Emirati motorsport legend and current FIA/President Mohammed Ben Sulayem, and is organized by the Emirates Motorsports Organization (EMSO). The event rapidly gained global fame with all the biggest names in international motorsport attempting to conquer the dunes of the UAE's unforgiving Rub'Al Khali Desert, the world's largest sand ocean.

34 years in, and thanks to the patronage of **Abu Dhabi's Government** through the strategic partnership with the **Abu Dhabi Sports Council** and energy partner **ADNOC Distribution**, the Abu Dhabi Desert Challenge has earned the reputation of being an event run to the highest safety and organizational standards, where participants can benefit from Abu Dhabi's world-class infrastructure.

Today, the Abu Dhabi Desert Challenge is considered by competitors to be the most technical race on the calendar. Celebrating its 34th edition, the event returns with an emphasis on sustainability, and with added racing thrills, 2025 will see the introduction of a new rally bivouac and the action reaching new areas of the Al Dhafra region, after a successful introduction last year.

Respecting the rules and guidelines means respecting the environment

All competitors and team members must at all times respect the FIA / FIM and Organizer's environmental rules:

- It is compulsory to use an environmental mat (or other effective and approved system) to prevent soil and water contamination at events. The Environmental Mat must be composed of an absorbent upper part and an impermeable lower part and must be used:
 - Wherever work on vehicles/motorcycles is allowed by the organizers.
 - In the Parc Ferme.
 - In the paddock at all events.
 - Under all waste oil and fuel containers provided by the organizers.
 - o At all official refueling points.
 - Under all thermic powered generators and power washers.
- Cleaning of vehicles/motorcycles, equipment and parts, where permitted by the regulations, must only be carried out at places with cleaning facilities.
- Only water without the addition of chemical products (for example detergent, even if it is eco or biodegradable) is permitted.
- Each participant and/or team member is responsible for the waste generated by his team during the event. Organizer's containers
 for waste must be used as directed.
- Respect all other rules and guidelines of the event.







EMSO Sustainability Policy

Emirates Motorsports Organization (EMSO) is playing a **leadership role in development of motorsport and encouraging motor sport stakeholders across UAE** to incorporate best practices of sustainability framework by pursuing a holistic approach to environmental concerns.

EMSO strives to adhere to the Best Practice Principles (BPP) framework of FIA by setting up core elements of its environmental impact and incorporating systematic approach to Environmental Management System (EMS).

Automobile and Touring Club for United Arab Emirates (ATCUAE) is the mobility division of the Emirates Motorsports Organization (EMSO) and complies to the same Sustainability Policy.

EMSO commitment is defined as follows:

- 1. Collaboration with motor venues, organizers, sport clubs and competitors to promote and guide towards best environmental practices.
- 2. To collaborate with government entities and comply with legal requirements and legislation on national and international levels.
- 3. Encourage motor sport stakeholders across UAE to pursue sustainable actions for environment.
- 4. Support FIA Action for Environment and FIM Ride Green.
- 5. Demonstrate commitment to BPP by continuously improving on sustainability performance.
- 6. Continue to raise awareness of environmental concerns to senior management, staff and volunteers.

7. Minimize core elements of environmental impact by preserving water resources, implementing responsible waste management and energy saving systems.

8. Conduct an annual review of EMS to review environmental objectives and targets.








EMSO Environmental Code

The FIM's goal is to establish a culture of sustainability in motorcycle sport worldwide. In order to achieve this, the FIM will:

Cultural Sites of Al Ain (Hafit, Hili, Bidaa Bint Saud and Oases Areas) – UNESCO WORLD HERITAGE CONVENTION

The Cultural Sites of Al Ain **(Hafit, Hili, Bidaa Bint Saud and Oases Areas)** constitute a serial property that testifies to sedentary human occupation of a desert region since the Neolithic period with vestiges of many prehistoric cultures.

Remarkable vestiges in the property include circular stone tombs (ca 2500 B.C.), wells and a wide range of adobe constructions: residential buildings, towers, palaces and administrative buildings.

Hili moreover features one of the oldest examples of the sophisticated aflaj irrigation system which dates back to the Iron Age.

Waste at the Hazza Bin Zayed Stadium will be managed by the stadium service provider.

Waste in the service park – located next to the stadium, and at Al Jahili Fort (press conference venue), will be managed by Tadweer Group, official Abu Dhabi Desert Challenge sustainability partner.

BATHROOMS

Gate 1 – open during daytime only Gate 7 – open 24/7

Refueling and waste oil collection

REFUELING

Refueling will be carried out exclusively by authorized personnel in collaboration with our energy partner, ADNOC Distribution. All procedures will adhere strictly to the UAE's environmental standards and regulations, ensuring safety and sustainability throughout the event.

WASTE OIL

Oil drums for waste oil and fuel will be provided and managed by ADNOC Distribution, at all service and refueling locations during the stages. Designated waste oil collection points will be clearly marked with signs to ensure proper disposal and environmental compliance.









Measures of noise emissions, Biodiversity, Social impact

MEASURES OF NOISE EMISSIONS

The event will run during the hours the government allows to comply with the local noise regulations. The organizer will obtain all the necessary permissions.

BIODIVERSITY

The coexistence with the event, environment and the native vegetation must be respected leaving all the possible natural flora around the facilities, cleaning only the areas needed to follow local rules.

SOCIAL IMPACT

This event's mission is to generate as little environmental impact as possible. For this to be accomplished from the beginning, we will promote it on social media to encourage people to protect the environment.
